STRUCTURE

- Sets the tone
- Hold students accountable
- Builds from day one

- Go over tests at the end of class
- Have students pass back papers
- Be open to student input

- Be firm but approachable
- Teach a "mirror philosophy"
- Teach acceptable behavior
- Model what you preach

- Praise positivity
- Believe in your students
- Build relationships with students
